



04 NIGHTS 05 DAYS TOUR ITINERARY TO SRI LANKA

DAY 01 Airport - Kandy



Up on arrival you will warmly welcome to Sri Lanka By our representatives at KIA arrival lounge and proceed to kandy en route visit Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage the only orphanage in world for living giant on earth, orphanage, nursery and captive breeding ground for wild Asian elephants as of now there were 88 elephants, including 37 males and 51 females from 3 generations, living in Pinnawala. The orphanage was originally founded in order to afford care and protection to many of the orphaned and weaned wild elephants found wandering in and near the forests of Sri Lanka. It was established in 1975 by the Sri Lanka Department of Wildlife Conservation.



En route visit the herbal garden. During the past history of Sri Lanka, herbal garden was world renowned for its quality spices, and the Greeks, romans and the Arabic maintained their links with Sri Lanka through the spice trade. Spices are an essential element of the cuisine of Sri Lanka and the Ayurveda tradition. Visit to a garden specializes in the cultivation of these substances is an excellent way for purposes of new uses of certain ingredients that perhaps though they knew well. Europeans can buy the products in their natural state or in the form of oils and potions that are used by Ayurveda medicine. During the Dutch, very famous spices of Sri Lanka were export to different countries. That has earned the country the name of "island of the spices."



Visit temple of tooth relic, locally known as Sri Dalada maligawa. This temple is a UNESCO world heritage site, which is also one of the most revered Buddhist sites in the world. This is possibly the most sacred Buddhist shrine in the world. It is venerated not only by Buddhists in Sri Lanka but by Buddhists all over the world.

DAY 02 Kandy - Nuwaraeliya- Kandy

After a fast visit to a gem museum in Sri Lanka, long associated with the international gem and jewellery trade, has been known as the cradle of treasures for its precious, natural gemstones. Both the artisan culture of jewellery craftsmanship and Sri Lanka's gem industry has been widely acclaimed in literary works dating as far back as 250 B.C. Today Sri Lanka has made its mark in the international market and is known for quality gemstones and creating fine jewellery in a range of unique and exquisite designs. With this reputation, the Sri Lankan gem and jewellery industry is now geared to establish a world-class gem and jewellery hub. The entire industry employs approximately 600,000 persons including miners, cutters and polishers, dealers, jewellery designers, manufacturers and craftsmen, marketers and sales people. Sri Lanka is blessed with over 70 varieties of coloured stones out of 200 found in the world and is among the five most important gem-bearing nations of the world. Notably, Sri Lanka's major strength is the "Ceylon Sapphire". While Sri Lankan jewellery manufacturers demonstrate remarkable craftsmanship, Sri Lankan gem suppliers offer a wide range of Ceylon gems to the global gem market representing the country's breathtaking natural heritage.



Visit wood Carving Factory. Handicraft of woodcarving in Sri Lanka has a long history. The tradition of woodcarving in Sri Lanka is visible at Lankatilaka Temple and Ambakka Devale at Kandy. At these temples, miniature replicas of the low-relief wood carving done by the traditional woodcarvers can be bought at fair prices. The three dimensional carvings of ebony Elephants, Buddha are popular in Sri Lanka. Wood-carved decorative panels are used widely in Sri Lanka in the trade of interior decoration too. A wide range of handicraft items made of wood combine utility and beauty adding elegance to your lifestyle, such as wall hangings, fancy jewellery, figurines, sculpture, lacquer products, gift boxes, toys, educational items for pre-school children, household items are some of the woodcraft items produced in Sri Lanka.



Visit silk factory. Silk's absorbency makes it comfortable to wear in warm weather and while active. Its low conductivity keeps warm air close to the skin during cold weather. It is often used for clothing such as shirts, ties, blouses, formal dresses, high fashion clothes, lining, lingerie, pajamas, robes, dress suits, sun dresses and Eastern folk costumes. For practical use, silk is excellent as clothing that protects from many biting insects that would.



After proceed to Nuwaraeliya enrouth at Ramboda visit the Hannuman Shrine which was dedicated to lord Hanuman and its believed to be the place where Hanumman been landed in the country in search of Sitha , can observe a 18 ft height Hanumman statute.



Visit a Tea Factory, which is one of the main sources of foreign exchange for Sri Lanka (formerly called Ceylon), and accounts for 2% of GDP, contributing over US \$1.5 billion in 2013 to the economy of Sri Lanka. It employs, over 1 million people, and in 1995 directly employed 215,338 on tea plantations and estates. In addition, tea planting by smallholders is the source of employment for thousands whilst it is also the main form of livelihoods for tens of thousands of families. Sri Lanka is the world's fourth-largest producer of tea. In 1995, it was the world's leading exporter of tea, with 23% of the total world export. The highest production of 340 million kg was recorded in 2013



Do a city tour at Nuwaraeliya, is a town in the central highlands of Sri Lanka with a picturesque landscape and temperate climate. It is located at an altitude of 1,868 m (6,128 ft) and is considered to be the most important location for Tea production in Sri Lanka. The town is overlooked by Pidurutalagala, the tallest mountain in Sri Lanka." The city was founded by Samuel Baker, the discoverer of Lake Albert and the explorer of the Nile in 1846. Nuwara Eliya's climate lent itself to becoming the prime sanctuary of the British civil servants and planters in Ceylon. Nuwara Eliya, called Little England. For a picturesque stroll, stop by the well-maintained Victoria Park or head for Gregory's Lake, which is located just south of the town. You can also hire boats here also visit the international Golf and race courses and visit Sitha eliya witness the legendry Sitha Amman temple in the Asoke Vathika experience aboat tour at Gregory lake.



After proceed to kandy.

Visit Kandy Lake is an artificial waterbody that is considered a sacred relic of the Temple of the Sacred Tooth. The lake was made back in 1807 and is one of the best places to visit for a walk or jog along. The shady area next to the temple offers its guests a view of the whole city. There are many temples near the waterbody, but the lake was built to beautify the Temple of the Sacred Tooth. The lake is surrounded by lush greenery and a picturesque mountain stands tall right behind the hydric beauty.

DAY 03 Kandy - Colombo



After Breakfast proceed to Colombo do a city tour and a shopping tour, Colombo is a commercial and business center of Sri Lanka located on west coast. The city blends together with old colonial type building, high-rise commercial buildings and hotels. It is filled with shopping malls, airline offices bazaars and interesting tourist attractions. Some of the finest structures built during the colonial times still preserved in one part of the City. During the city tour, visit BMICH, Colonial style Town hall, old parliament complex, replica of 'Aukana' Buddha statue, Galle face green, etc.

DAY 04 Colombo - Bentota - Colombo

After Breakfast proceed to Bentota, Mainly known for its wonderful resorts and spicy food, Bentota is not among the popularly frequented places in Sri Lanka. However, it is fast making its presence felt on the tourist's map and is on its way to become one of the most popular tourist spots in Sri Lanka. Located 65 km away from Colombo, Bentota is a place you must visit if you want solitude mixed with natural beauty.



Do a city tour at Bentota visit Beruwala Bay Beach that is just before reaching Aluthgama at the Bentota Bridge and Bentota Bay Beach just over the bridge are the most popular twin beaches in the coast. The coast to the further south and onwards to the Deep South too is replete with lovely tropical beaches. Bentota Beach ideal for (Optional) snorkeling, diving, sailing, wind surfing, water-skiing, and deep-sea fishing on a traditional outrigger canoe. Bentota enriched with safe swimming conditions in the season combined with fun water sport and exciting excursions that set up an ideal background for a relaxed holiday in Sri Lanka, is an attraction for the families.



Visit a sea turtle conservation project operated by the Wild Life Protection Society of Sri Lanka. It was established in 1988 to protect Sri Lanka's turtles from extinction. Since then it has released about 3.5 million baby turtles into the wild. The hatchery pays fishermen for eggs that they collect at night along the long sandy beach. Although October to April is the main laying season, some eggs (mostly green turtles) can be found at Kosgoda.



Visit Madu Ganga is a shallow water body in south-west Sri Lanka, which enters the sea at Balapitiya. Together with the smaller Randonbe Lake, to which it is connected by two narrow channels, it forms the Madu Ganga wetland. Its estuary and the many mangrove islets on it constitute a complex coastal wetland ecosystem. It might be one of the last remaining tracts of untouched mangrove forests in Sri Lanka
